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Introduction

Since the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) deregulated first aid training in 2013, employers have been free to choose their own training providers, provided they meet with the HSE criteria.

The full HSE criteria are set out in its <u>General Information Sheet No 3: Selecting a first aid training provider: A guide for employers.</u>

Good practice also suggests that training providers should meet the parallel requirements set out by the First Aid Awarding Organisation Forum (FAAOF) in its statement on <u>Assessment principles</u> for regulated first aid qualifications.

Lifesaver First Aid Services (LFAS) meets the requirements of both of these bodies in full. In many cases, we also exceed the basic requirements, so you can be assured of quality training that meets your needs.

Employers must undertake 'due diligence' on any first aid training providers to ensure that they meet the HSE requirements. This document is designed to make that process quick and easy when selecting us as your provider. We even include a printable checklist that you can download and complete the easily evidence your due diligence checks.

This booklet outlines each of the HSE requirements and then clearly shows how we meet or exceed the criteria. We are also happy to provide copies of our supporting documents, such as policy statements or insurance certificates on request.

Due diligence measures

Trainers and assessors

HSE requirement	Met?	How does LFAS meet this requirement?
Do the trainers / assessors have a current First Aid at Work certificate or qualify for an exemption?	Met and exceeded	All trainers and assessors within LFAS hold an FAW certificate as a minimum. The majority of our training staff hold other additional qualifications (such as FREC) and/or have additional occupational experience (such as experience as Community First Responders or Cadet Force Medical Support Officers).
Do the trainers / assessors have an appropriate training and / or assessing qualification?	Met and exceeded	All training staff hold at least the Level 3 Award in Education and Training (or equivalent). Some staff hold higher training awards. All assessing staff hold at least the Level 3 Award in Education and Training, with the 'principles and practices of assessment' module (or equivalent). Many staff hold higher assessing awards (such as CAVA).

HSE requirement	Met?	How does LFAS meet this requirement?
Is there a documented quality assurance plan designating an individual to take responsibility for quality assurance, including assessment of the performance of trainers and assessors at least annually?	Met in full	We have an Internal Quality Assurance policy and procedures, which are available publicly on our website. We have a risk rating for trainers and assessors to determine their level of assessments. This is never less than annually.
Does the designated person have a current FAW certificate or qualify for an exemption?	Met and exceeded	 The designated person holds a FAW certificate plus the following additional training: Level 3 Certificate in First Response Emergency Care (FREC3). Level 4 Certificate in First Response Emergency Care (FREC4). Level 3 Certificate in First Responder on Scene – Ambulance Service (FROS).
Does the designated person have an assessing/verifying qualification?	Met and exceeded	The designated person holds the Level 3 Certificate in Assessing Vocational Achievement, the highest assessing award possible.
Is there a documented course evaluation procedure?	Met and exceeded	We have a written evaluation policy, which is available on our website. All learners on our courses are encouraged to complete an evaluation form and leave feedback via our website, social media and other online sites. We also have separate policies for handling complaints, appeals and malpractice, which are all made available to learners and the general public via our website.
Is there a documented complaints procedure?	Met in full	We have a written complaints procedure, which is communicated to all learners at the start of the course and which is available to the general public via our website.

Is FAW/EFAW taught in accordance with current guidelines on adult basic life support published by the Resuscitation Council (UK), and for other aspects of first aid, in accordance with current guidelines published by the Voluntary Aid Societies or other published guidelines that are supported by a responsible body of medical opinion?	Met in full	All of our training is delivered in accordance with the latest guidance from the Resuscitation Council (UK), the current first aid manual published by the voluntary aid societies and other suitable professional bodies, for example: Cuidelines from Skills for Health (e.g. for medication administration) Guidelines from the Royal College of Surgeons Edinburgh, Faculty of Prehospital Care (e.g. for tourniquet protocols) In all cases, the source of information for our courses can be found in the qualification specification.
